General Eligibility Criteria

Though each scholarship has its own eligibility criteria, there are several criteria that each award has in common. Generally, an eligible applicant for these awards must:

- **Be a current student:** Plan to be a current WSU student at the time the award is funded, which will be the August following submission of the application by the January deadline. (That is, students *who graduate prior to the funding of awards in August are not eligible* to receive an award.)
- **Have a mentor:** Have identified a WSU research mentor who will be able to submit a simple endorsement of your application by *Friday, February 6, 2026*.
- **Plan to present at SURCA:** Agree to participate in SURCA 2027 on March 22, 2027 if you receive an award. Specifically, students who are selected as *recipients*

of these awards must apply to present at and participate in [SURCA](#) in the academic year in which their award is funded.
